Dear Parent/Guardian:

We are planning for our 7th and 8th grade learners as they enter the 2021-2022 school year. As we prepare all learners for the challenges of high school, college, and future careers, we believe it is necessary to augment our dynamic learning environment as we continue to support creativity, collaboration, communication, critical thinking, digital citizenship, and technological skills.

In an effort to move learners toward these outcomes, St. Elizabeth School will continue our 1-to-1 digital learning environment at the junior high level for the 2021-2022 school year. Specifically, this means that every learner in Grades 7-8 receives a Chromebook for his/her use throughout their school day and educationally at home. Chromebooks are a personal computer designed for use while connected to the Internet, supports applications that reside on the Web, and educationally sound extensions to support our classroom exploration. These devices operate using a Chrome Operating System that have multiple layers of security, cloud storage, and the most popular Google products, such as Google Docs and Drive.

Every 7th and 8th grade learner will receive:

- an ASUS C204EE Chromebook
- an ASUS AC 2-piece Charger
- a Chromebook protective sleeve with zippers and strap

The Chromebook is valued at \$300 which includes the Chrome license. The great news is that thanks to our CPTA, and efforts to augment the school's operating budget, St. Elizabeth School will fully fund this purchase. We do ask that each learner in our 1:1 initiative pay an annual \$100 user fee to cover maintenance and support of this program.

During the first days of school, learners will receive the Chromebook, power cord, and storage sleeve along with a set of expectations and guidelines for their use and care. Teachers will vary in their expectations for Chromebook use, but your child will be using this tool for instruction, assignments, projects, research, and assessment throughout the day. Then, at home for enrichment, further assignments, and completion of activities.

We propose to meet our Diocesan Content Standards enthusiastically by raising the expectation for each learner to use technology and digital media, strategically, responsibly, and capably. We have an obligation to direct, develop, and utilize the technological fluency that learners bring to us; and to infuse technology into the curriculum through engagement in authentic work. We also have an obligation to create an environment in which we can develop independent, lifelong learners. The integration of this technology will prove very beneficial to learners and afford them the opportunity for exposure to a learning environment that is conducive to creativity, collaboration, communication, critical thinking, and exposure to a wide array of educational resources during their time in school and well beyond the traditional school day.
